Elizabeth S. Ginsburg, MD, is the Medical Director of the IVF Program at Brigham & Women's Hospital in Boston, where she is also the Director of the Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility Fellowship Program. Dr. Ginsburg graduated from the Rudolf Steiner School; Wellesley

College, where she was elected to Phi Beta Kappa; and the Mount Sinai School of Medicine, where she was elected to Alpha Omega Alpha Medical Honor Society, a professional medical organization that recognizes and advocates for excellence in scholarship and the highest ideals in the profession of medicine. She completed a residency at Brigham and Women's/Massachusetts General Hospital in Obstetrics and Gynecology, followed by a fellowship at Brigham & Women's in Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility (REI). Dr. Ginsburg is board certified in Gynecological Surgery, Obstetrics and Gynecology, and REI.

Dr. Ginsburg has been a clinician-researcher on the faculty of the REI Division of Brigham & Women's Hospital since completing her fellowship in 1991. She has both teaching and administrative duties in addition to a clinical practice that focuses on IVF and fertility preservation but includes a wide range of issues in reproductive endocrinology including recurrent pregnancy loss. Her research interests align with her clinical practice, and focus on IVF outcomes and fertility preservation. She regularly teaches medical students, as well as residents and fellows, and has mentored many of them in clinical research.

A Professor of Obstetrics, Gynecology and Reproductive Biology at Harvard Medical School, Dr. Ginsburg is also the Past President of both SART and the New England Fertility Society. She has served as Chair of the Brigham & Women's Assisted Reproductive Technologies Ethics Committee for many years, and is currently a member of the ASRM Ethics Committee.
